

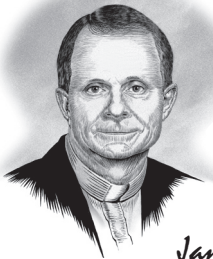

What Harms Our Relationship With The God Who Loves Us?

Know This...

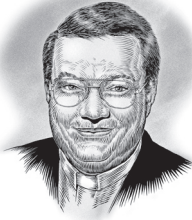
God created Adam and Eve to share in His holiness and glory forever. He gave them stainless souls full of grace. He created them without conflict between right reason and desires of the flesh. When Satan convinced Adam and Eve that they would not die if they ate from the tree of good and knowledge, they lost these two gifts for all of us.



John: Sin and death entered the world through Adam's disobedience. Our attraction to sin harms our relationship with God.

James: When Adam and Eve listened to Satan, man lost communion with God. The essence of sin is rebellion against God and opposition to Him.

John: God's original plan for us included perpetual happiness, perfect health, companionship, food, and dominion over His creation. It did not include pain, suffering, and death.



James: There are two types of sin. Original sin is the absence of grace in our soul. Actual sin is a free, conscious, and informed personal act to ignore God's love and will.

John: There are two gravities of actual sin. Venial sin is disobedience against God that does not involve serious moral matter. Mortal sin involves serious moral matter and destroys all the divine life of grace in our soul.

James: When we sin, we surrender to temptation and reject God's will, laws, and love. If we die in a state of mortal sin, we condemn ourselves to hell.

Jesus uses exaggeration to stress the deadliness of sin. "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than with two feet to be thrown into hell. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into hell, where their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched." Mk 9:43, 45, 47-48

"Sin is an offense against God as well as a fault against reason, truth, and right conscience. Sin is a deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the eternal law of God." ccc Glossary "Everyone who sins dies. Every man fears the death of the flesh, few the death of the soul. 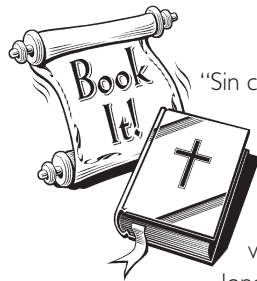
