Who Buys Our One Way Ticket To Hell?

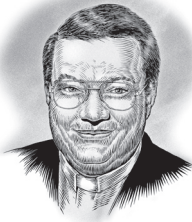
Know This...

Some people say, "There is no heaven and there certainly is no hell." Others say, "Hell is the pain and suffering and misery we endure in this world." But informed, faithful Christians say, "Hell exists. Those who do evil in this life will suffer eternal separation from God in hell." We can deny its existence, as many people do; but Jesus, more than anyone else in the Bible, says hell exists. Read His words in Mt 18:8-9 or Mk 9:43-48.



John: When we reject the teaching of Christ and His Church and commit mortal sin, we make a down payment on our one way ticket to hell.

James: Hell is the eternal home of Satan, the fallen angels, and men and women who die in a state of unrepented and unforgiven mortal sin.



John: God does not condemn anyone to hell. We condemn ourselves when we reject His merciful love, commit mortal sin, and refuse to confess and repent of our sins.

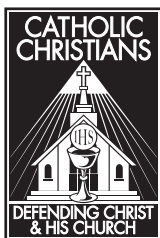
James: Our free will frees us to choose hell over heaven. Man is not willing to relinquish his free will; but we would love for God to eliminate hell. God cannot eliminate hell without eliminating our free will.

John: If we spend our life seeking God, we will find eternal separation from Him incomprehensible, repugnant, and unacceptable.

James: God gives us sufficient grace to be saved; but some of us freely choose to reject it.

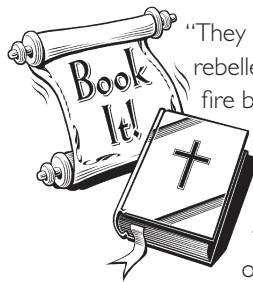

Mt 10:28 "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." Mt 25:34 "Depart from me, you accused, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels." Mt 25:41

"We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love Him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against Him, against our neighbor or against ourselves... To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from Him for ever by our own free choice." Saint Peter warns us, "For if God did not spare the angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to pits of nether gloom to be kept until the judgment, if He did not spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah, a herald of righteousness, then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trial, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment until the day of judgment, and especially those who indulge in the lust of defiling passion and despise authority." 2 Pet 2:4-5a, 9-10
