Is The Immaculate Conception About Jesus Or Mary?

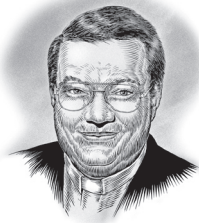
Know This...

Many Catholics confuse the Incarnation of Jesus with the Immaculate Conception of Mary. In the Incarnation, Jesus, the Son of God, assumed human nature and became man in His mother Mary's womb. In the Immaculate Conception, Mary, at the moment of her conception in her mother's womb, was saved from original sin through the grace and merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. So the Immaculate Conception is about both Jesus and Mary since Jesus saved Mary from the stain of original sin.



John: Just as Adam and Eve originally were created full of grace, Mary was conceived full of grace in the womb of her mother. But unlike Adam and Eve, who lost their original holiness when they listened to Satan instead of trusting in God, Mary remained sinless.

James: All of us are in need of a Savior. At Mary's conception, Jesus saved her from the stain of original sin. Freed from the effects of original sin, Mary freely and without apprehension gave her consent to become the Mother of God.

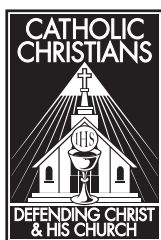


John: Pope Pius IX universally proclaimed the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854. He didn't define new belief; rather, he issued an infallible teaching document that authoritatively expressed what the Church had always believed.

James: Mary, through the merits and divine intervention of her Son and Savior, Jesus Christ, was preserved free from original sin from the first moment of her existence.

PAPA SAYS

"By the authority of Jesus Christ our Lord, of the blessed apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own: We declare, pronounce, and define that the doctrine that holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, is a doctrine revealed by God and therefore to be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful."

Pope Pius IX, Ineffabilis Deus, Dec. 8, 1854, (Dogma of the Immaculate Conception)
