## Where's Our Road Map For Serving God?

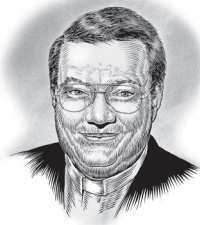
*Know This...*

God gave us the Ten Commandments. Jesus simplified them into two. Then, to help us live them, He taught the Beatitudes and explained the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. What is faith? Believing in the unseen. What is hope? Trusting in God's promise. What is charity? Loving and caring for others. The Beatitudes and Virtues are our road map for serving God.



**John:** God created us that we might come to know, love, and serve Him; and, that we might sing His praise and glory as we make Him the center and focus of our daily lives.

**James:** Living a Christian life is challenging; but, if we live the Beatitudes, we will share in the ultimate reward: joy and happiness in this life and eternal salvation in the next.



**John:** The eight Beatitudes do not contain the complete teaching of Jesus; but they do show us how to grow in Christian holiness and perfection.

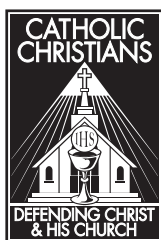
**James:** The Beatitudes make us aware of our need for God's mercy and love. They make us aware of our need to be humble, obedient, forgiving, and persistent.

**John:** Jesus took on human nature to set the standard for fulfilling the two great commandments, for living the Beatitudes, and for practicing the Virtues.

**James:** When we live the Beatitudes and practice the Virtues, we find happiness, we serve God, and we fulfill His plans for us.

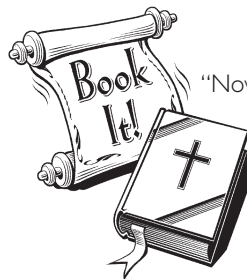

Virtue is not the knowing of good and evil. Rather, virtue is the doing of good and not-doing of evil.” Lactantius, 310 A.D.
