Does God Desire Our Pain And Suffering?

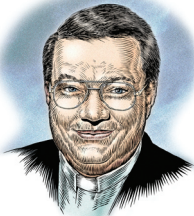
Know This...

God loves us so much that He uses every means, except force, to draw us to Himself. God is not vengeful. He's an all-knowing, all-loving, and all-merciful Father who always knows what we need. Through His free gift of grace God seeks to keep us from harming ourselves through sin. While God permits pain and suffering, He seeks to use pain and suffering to draw us and those we love to Himself.



John: Perhaps the reality of pain and suffering, more than any other human condition regardless of one's religion, causes people to lose their hope and trust in God.

James: While pain and suffering may cause a person's faith to waver, Catholics are challenged to allow their faith in Jesus to deepen as they confront pain and suffering.



John: Most religions struggle to explain the value of suffering; but for 2000 years, the Catholic Church has proclaimed the virtue of redemptive suffering.

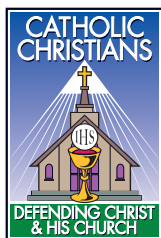
James: When we are ill and suffering, the *Catechism* says we experience "human powerlessness, limitations, and finitude." A faithful Catholic finds strength in Jesus.

John: He gives us the grace we need to resist any temptation to be self-absorbed in our pain and suffering. Instead, we imitate Jesus by offering up our pain and suffering for others.

James: Pain and suffering are a consequence of evil and not a direct consequence of God's will. He only wants to draw us to Himself.

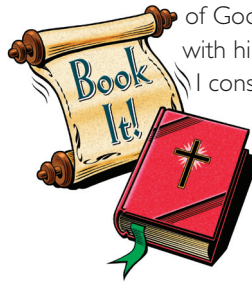


BE ATTITUDES
