Why's The Church The World's Moral Beacon?

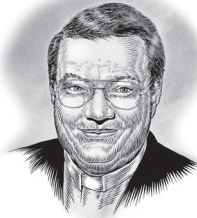
Know This...

Can you imagine our world without Jesus? Can you imagine our world without His Church? To the faithful Christian, the first is impossible to imagine. To the faithful Catholic Christian, both are impossible to imagine. Jesus and His Church are the Father's inseparable gifts to the world. Neither is dispensable; one is God and the other is faultless and not subject to failure or decay. God speaks through His Church on issues of faith and morals. It is the Church alone that stands between God's moral teaching and overwhelming moral corruption and depravity. Many immoral people acknowledge this reality by trying to destroy her.



John: Jesus gave His Church the fullness of all moral truth when He affirmed the two great commandments: love God with all your heart, your soul, your mind, and your strength; then love your neighbor as yourself.

James: Informed, faithful Catholics cannot imagine a world without Jesus or His Church. We recognize and acknowledge that being a true follower of Christ calls us to distinguish good from evil.



John: We must not do evil to bring about good. The end never justifies the means. God, not man, is the final judge of what is right and wrong. God's right judgment in faith and morals resides in His Church.

James: While we must follow our conscience in all decision making, our conscience must never be set in opposition to the moral law or the Church—the constant beacon that distinguishes good from evil.
