Why Do Catholics Keep Jesus On The Cross?

Know This...

Why do Catholics accept false answers to disingenuous faith questions, and then leave the Church? Because many non-Catholics appear confident despite being misinformed, and too many Catholics are unprepared to respond. It's time for us to answer faith questions with confidence. No amount of misinformation can alter the fact that Jesus established one Church—the Catholic Church. It's the sole source of His truth. Can you answer this disingenuous question often asked of Catholics: "Why do you keep Jesus nailed to the cross; don't you know He's risen?" The Church gives us the answer in Sacred Tradition and Scripture.



John: Catholics know that Jesus has been raised from the dead. The crucifix—with its suffering Corpus (the image of Jesus' Body)—is not a rejection of the Risen Christ. It's a potent reminder of the Father's undying love and the Son's unwavering obedience.

James: God the Father sent His only begotten Son to be crucified for our salvation. So the Apostle Paul told the Corinthians that it is only through the power of the crucified Christ that the chains of sin and death were broken.

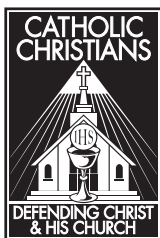


John: The "empty" cross is a most cherished Christian image; but the crucifix is a more visible reminder that Jesus calls us to take up our crosses daily and follow in His steps; even if we have to suffer unto death.

James: When we're sick, we look to doctors for help. When people challenge our Catholic Christian faith with disingenuous questions, we must confidently look to the indefectible Church for help.

PAPA SAYS

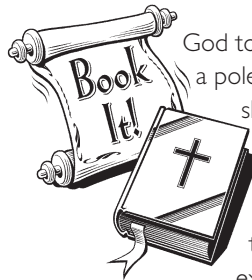
