## Who Is The Author Of Sacred Scripture?

*Know This...*

The Bible is the best selling book of all time, but it's not the most read book. All too often it sits and collects dust. In 410 A.D., St. Jerome wrote, "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." The Bible is the inerrant Word of God. Its pages should be stained and torn from use, loaded with highlighted verses and handwritten notes. The Holy Spirit is the author of Sacred Scripture. He inspired men to write it.



**John:** The Bible is a Catholic book. It didn't fall from the sky. It didn't come with a table of contents, punctuation, or numbered chapters and verses. The Church formed the Bible; the Bible didn't form the Church.

**James:** All Christians are indebted to the Catholic Church because She, guided by the Holy Spirit, wrote the New Testament and professed that both the Old and New Testaments comprise Sacred Scripture.



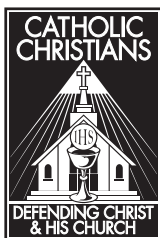
**John:** The Old Testament embodies 46 books. The New Testament embodies 27. St. Augustine said, "The New lies hidden in the Old, while the Old is revealed in the New."

**James:** In the fourth and fifth centuries, several Church Councils with the approval of the Pope, established the canon of Scripture. The Council of Trent universally confirmed this in the sixteenth century.

**John:** The Church calls us to accept and venerate Holy Tradition and Sacred Scripture with equal devotion and reverence.

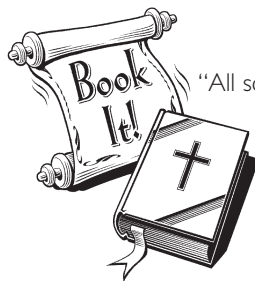
