Can I Know With Certainty That I Am Saved?

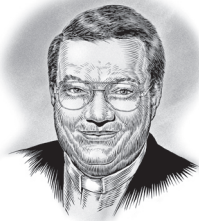
Know This...

We cannot know with absolute certainty that we are saved. Jesus' death and resurrection won our redemption and opened the gates of heaven; but Jesus clearly proclaims in the Bible that if we, the faithful, are to spend eternity with Him, we must persevere in faith and good works. Jesus and the Apostles never preached the "assurance of salvation." If we come before the judgment seat of Christ in a state of grace, we will live with Him eternally in heaven.



John: For 2000 years, the Church has taught the doctrine of salvation just as Jesus handed it on to the Apostles: *we are saved by grace through faith working in charity.*

James: The idea that we can know with "absolute" certainty that we are saved was first taught in the 16th century by some early Protestant reformers. Many Christians still believe it.



John: They often use 1 Jn 5:13 to support this belief: "I write this to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life."

James: To avoid taking this verse out of context, we must digest all five chapters of St. John's first epistle.

John: He says we can't know God if we don't keep His commandments. We can't love God if we love the things of this world and we don't love one another.

James: We may choose to reject God's free gift of grace; even after many years of faithful obedience to His will. We can only live in the hope of salvation by constantly responding to His grace.

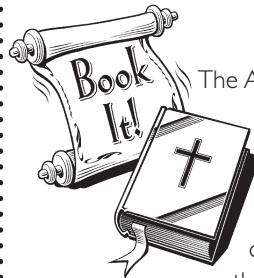


"However great may be a man's righteousness, he must take thought lest something in him which he himself did not see be found to be deserving of blame
