Is Baptism Necessary For Salvation?

Know This...

When Adam and Eve trusted Satan over God, grace abandoned their souls as sin entered them. As children of Adam and Eve, we have been born into a fallen world with the stain of original sin on our souls. Baptism washes away original sin, personal sin, and the temporal punishment due to sin. Baptism fills our souls with grace and makes us children of God. Jesus made Baptism necessary for salvation.

Saints Peter and Paul confirm this in their epistles.



John: Baptism is a beautiful and powerful gift from God. It sets us free from sin, makes us members of the Body of Christ, and incorporates us into His Church.

James: This sacrament unites us to Jesus' death and resurrection, makes us pleasing to our heavenly Father, and saves us from eternal separation with God.



John: While baptism is necessary for salvation, the unbaptized can be saved. "God has bound salvation to the Sacrament of Baptism, but He Himself is not bound by His sacraments." CCC 1257

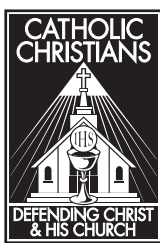
James: Sacramental Baptism is the normal means of being baptized; but there is also baptism of blood (martyrdom), baptism of explicit desire, and baptism of implicit desire.

John: Baptism seals the Christian with an indelible mark that claims him for Christ. Sin cannot erase this mark.

James: Christians who remain faithful to their Baptismal calling merit the reward of eternal life.
