

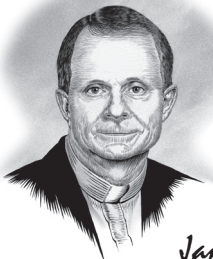

## Is Jesus Christ True God, True Man, Or Both?

### Know This...

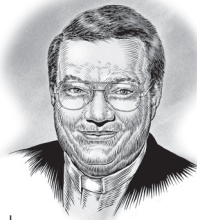
The Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity became man without ceasing to be God. He is not two persons, but one Person with two natures: divine and human. Jesus did not spend His youth discovering that He was God. His humanity was always aware of His divinity. His human will was always subordinate to His divine will. Like us, Jesus experienced joy and acceptance, hunger and pain, temptation and rejection, even suffering and death. Millions of followers have given their lives for Him.



**John:** A Christian is a baptized follower of Jesus of Nazareth: a Jew who claimed to be the Son of the God, who took on human flesh, and died for the salvation of mankind.

**James:** Jesus is the only religious teacher who did not subordinate Himself to His message. Jesus is the message. He's the Word.

**John:** Christians believe that Jesus Christ is true God and true man. Jesus means 'God saves' in Hebrew. Christ means 'anointed.'



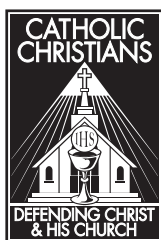
**James:** At His conception in the womb of the Virgin Mary, Jesus united a human nature with His divine nature; yet, He remained a divine Person.

**John:** Jesus was born free of Original Sin, full of grace, and unable to sin.

**James:** God became one like us in order to save us from death and sin, to show us God and His path to holiness, and to make us His sons and daughters.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... 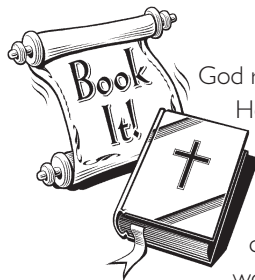
## PAPA SAYS

"Therefore the Word of God, Himself God, the Son of God who 'in the beginning was with God,' through whom 'all things were made' and 'without' whom 'was nothing made,' with the purpose of delivering man from eternal death, became man: so bending Himself to take on Him our humility without decrease in His own majesty, that remaining what He was and assuming what He was not, He might unite the true form of a slave to that form in which He is equal to God the Father; and join both natures together by such a compact that the lower should not be swallowed up in its exaltation nor the higher impaired by its new associate." *St. Leo the Great, Pope, Sermo 1 in Nativitate Domini, 21. 2*

"Those who believe in His name are those who fully hold the name of Christ not in any way lessening His divinity or His humanity." *St. Thomas Aquinas, Commentary on St. John* "The only-begotten Son of God, wanting to make us sharers in His divinity, assumed our nature, so that He, made man, might make men gods." *St. Thomas Aquinas, Opusc., 57: 1-4* Jesus can make us holy.
