Why Care About Relics, Statues, & Images?

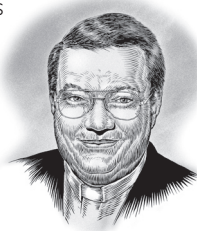
Know This...

When we die, whether we know God or not, we are judged for heaven or hell. If we die in a state of grace, we are destined for heaven. If we died in a state of mortal sin, we will spend eternity in hell. God gives each of us the grace we need to spend eternity with Him in heaven. The fullness of God's truth is only found in the Catholic Church; so the more we partake of her gifts, the stronger we are in turning away from sin and toward God. Relics, statues, and images—properly viewed and used—help us focus on the reality and beauty of God.



John: Relics are the personal possessions, clothing, bones, or ashes of saints held in high-esteem and revered by the Church. They do not possess magical powers; but they are often associated with miraculous healings.

James: Likewise, statues and images of Jesus, angels, and saints are not idols; they are not representations of false gods. They can help to awaken and deepen our sense of God's presence in our lives as we seek to grow in holiness.



John: In Ex 20:4-5, God says we should not carve idols and then bow down and worship them. In Ex 25:18-19, He directs the Israelites to carve images of angels and to mount them on the Ark of the Covenant.

James: Relics, statues, and images do not provide grace; but properly used, they can open us up to receive the grace of God that brings us home to Christ.

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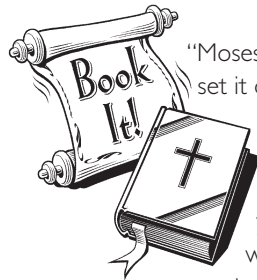
